



The 16th FinnMETKO trade fair will be held on 1–3 September 2016 In Jämsä, on sites belonging to Jämsä College, the City of Jämsä and private landowners. The fair is held every second year. The 2014 fair gathered over 36,000 visitors and 430 exhibitors in Myllymäki, Jämsä. About 10% of these visitors were from overseas.

For visitors:

FinnMETKO is Finland's largest and most important heavy machinery industry trade and sales fair. Established in 1987, the fair is one of the biggest of its kind in Europe. In 2016 the fair will be held for the 16th time.

Machinery demonstrations and test drives are a central feature of the fair. Chipping and crushing demonstrations with wood energy machines and large-scale forest machinery demonstrations are some of the highlights.

The transportation industry has traditionally had a strong presence at the fair. Commercial vehicles are well represented.

Producers, sellers and marketers of additional devices, accessories, financing, training, components, spare parts and services related to the heavy machinery industry and industry stakeholders are also represented at the fair.

The bioenergy industry has a strong presence at the fair. The theme of the fair is "power from bioeconomy".

FinnMETKO2016 comprises a 200 hectare exhibition area with inside and outdoor sections, parking and work demonstration, test drive and competition areas.

The main exhibition area comprises heath and park forest and gravel areas. Jämsä College's concrete grounds and covered parking area are part of the fair. The Myllymäki Business Park area opposite the main gate is also an important part of the exhibition area. The FinnMETKO hall includes 90 ready-built 4 x 4 m stands.

Felling demonstrations will be given as different energy wood and thinning fellings in the forest area next to Myllymäki Business Park. First thinning and energy wood sites are also located in the vicinity of the FinnMETKO exhibition hall. E.g. the following companies will give work demonstrations: Agco ltd "Valtra", Nisula Forest Oy, Komatsu Forest Oy, Ponsse Oyj, Sampo-Rosenlew Oy, Profi Pro Oy and Cargotech Oy.

The 10 hectare earthworks and bioenergy machinery demonstration site is located in the Kaakkolampi gravel extraction site about 500 m from the main exhibition area.



The fair is organised by The Trade Association of Finnish Forestry and Earth Moving Contractors, Keski-Suomen Koneyrittäjät ry and Finnmetko Oy. The Trade Association of Finnish Forestry and Earth Moving Contractors has 2,500 earthworks, wood harvesting and energy industry member companies.

Connections – 250 km from Helsinki The FinnMETKO2016 fair is located in Jämsä, Central Finland, about 250 km away from Helsinki, 90 km from Tampere and 50 km from Jyväskylä. The nearest airports are in Tampere and Jyväskylä. Jämsä can be easily reached by car, train and bus. The fair has free parking areas for cars and buses.
